

1. PREAMBLE

The preamble is an integral part of this By-law.

2. <u>REPLACEMENT</u>

This By-Law replaces any former By-Law dealing with the remuneration or compensation of the Town Council members.

3. <u>REMUNERATION</u>

Remuneration of the Council Members is set on an annual basis. Starting January 1st, 2019, the remuneration of the Town Mayor is set at \$48,750. *Starting January 1st*, 2022, the remuneration of each of the Councillors is set at \$22,833. In the event that the expense allowance stipulated at section 5 become taxable under federal and/or provincial government act, the remuneration shall be adjusted to annul the incurred tax impact. The adjustment will be calculated taking into consideration that the remuneration of each member of the council does not constitute his or her sole revenue. To make the adjustment, the marginal tax rate for federal tax will be assumed to be 26% and for the Quebec tax it will be assumed to be 24%.

4. **PRO MAYOR**

Where the period during which the acting mayor replaces the mayor exceeds thirty (30) consecutive days, the municipality shall pay to him such additional remuneration as is required for him to receive, from that time until the end of the replacement period, a sum equal to the remuneration of the mayor during the same period.

5. EXPENSE ALLOWANCE

Over and above any remuneration determined in this By-Law, all Council Members are entitled to an expense allowance of an amount equal to half the amount of the remuneration allocated in section 3, up to the maximum amount

7. <u>INDEXATION</u>

The remuneration previously set for the Council members is indexed upwards

as circumstance requires, every fiscal year beginning on January 1, 2020 and

in accordance with the consumer price index of the Province of Québec as of

November 30.

8. TRANSITION ALLOWANCE

The Town pays a transition allowance to any person who ceases to hold the

Mayor's office after having held it for at least the last 24 months prior to the

termination of the mandate.

The amount of this allowance is the one provided for in sections 30 and 31 of

the Act Respecting the Remuneration of Elected Municipal Officers.

For the purpose of setting the amount of this allowance, the remuneration

shall include the one paid to the Mayor by a representative agency mandated

by the Town or by a supramunicipal organization.

This allowance is paid as a lump sum payment within ninety (90) days after

the Mayor ceases to hold office.

9. <u>COMING INTO EFFECT</u>

This By-Law will come into effect in accordance with the law.

BY-LAW Nº 1023

BY-LAW NO. 1023 ESTABLISHING THE REMUNERATION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL MEMBERS

WHEREAS the Council deems it advisable to invoke the provisions of the *Act Respecting the Remuneration of Elected Municipal Officers*, L.R.Q., c. T-11.001;

WHEREAS Council deems appropriate to update By-law no. 744 establishing the remuneration of the Town council members;

WHEREAS notice of motion of this By-law was given and that a draft By-law was presented at the regular council meeting of December 3th, 2018;

WHEREAS a public notice was published December 4th, 2018, in accordance with the law;

ON JANUARY 7th, 2019 THE COUNCIL DECREES THE FOLLOWING:

1. PREAMBLE

The preamble is an integral part of this By-law.

2. REPLACEMENT

This By-Law replaces any former By-Law dealing with the remuneration or compensation of the Town Council members.

3. REMUNERATION

Remuneration of the Council Members is set on an annual basis. Starting January 1st, 2019, the remuneration of the Town Mayor is set at \$48,750. Starting January 1st, 2019, the remuneration of each of the Councillors is set at \$16,250. In the event that the expense allowance stipulated at section 5 become taxable under federal and/or provincial government act, the remuneration shall be adjusted to annul the incurred tax impact. The adjustment will be calculated taking into consideration that the remuneration of each member of the council does not constitute his or her sole revenue. To make the adjustment, the marginal tax rate for federal tax will be assumed to be 26% and for the Quebec tax it will be assumed to be 24%.

4. PRO MAYOR

Where the period during which the acting mayor replaces the mayor exceeds thirty (30) consecutive days, the municipality shall pay to him such additional remuneration as is required for him to receive, from that time until the end of the replacement period, a sum equal to the remuneration of the mayor during the same period.

5. EXPENSE ALLOWANCE

Over and above any remuneration determined in this By-Law, all Council Members are entitled to an expense allowance of an amount equal to half the amount of the remuneration allocated in section 3, up to the maximum amount allowed prescribed under section 19 of the Act Respecting the Remuneration of Elected Municipal Officers.

6. PROCEDURE FOR PAYING THE REMUNERATION AND EXPENSE ALLOWANCE

The remuneration and expense allowance established by this By-Law are paid by the Town monthly.

7. INDEXATION

The remuneration previously set for the Council members is indexed upwards as circumstance requires, every fiscal year beginning on January 1, 2020 and in accordance with the consumer price index of the Province of Québec as of November 30.

8. TRANSITION ALLOWANCE

The Town pays a transition allowance to any person who ceases to hold the Mayor's office after having held it for at least the last 24 months prior to the termination of the mandate.

The amount of this allowance is the one provided for in sections 30 and 31 of the Act Respecting the Remuneration of Elected Municipal Officers.
